This Month's Face of Paringa



Michael Hinds is quite new to archery but his competitive nature has seen him achieve some good results to date. As long as he doesn't "shank" the shot, he stays on target. (Note: "shank" is not an archery term). Michael also helps at the Saturday Come N Try and recently took the ground levels for the new Indoor Range.

To date Paringa has spent \$9,000 on the project and this is not covered by any grant, as your membership fees only cover the administration and target fees in the club, this money has come from the efforts of Paringa volunteers.

\$9,000 = 600 Come N Try participants. That is 56% of 2016s total Come N Try participants. Paringa volunteers contributed 324 hours (27 x Come N Try Saturdays) to raise this money for the benefit of the community and other club members.

If we didn't have volunteers, then the alternative would have been to raise this \$9,000 by increasing membership fees by \$180. How much do you think the extra \$80,000 still needed would increase membership fees, if volunteers weren't on the job?

Current status

- **23/6/17** – Parks email confirming Dev App and Letter of Consent signed and mailed.
- **22/6/17** -- WTC letter confirming success of \$3,300 grant for range extension.
- **16/6/17** – TCF Letter of Offer for \$90k grant arrived.
- **7/6/17** -- Site plan completed and planning application sent to to Chris @ Parks for their written approval to submit to council. per Dave Keller – Cyclad Buildings

Once the WTC approve the Development Application it will be time to start looking at fund raising. We need another \$15,000 to reach the budget target of \$80,000 club funds.

Arrow assault at range

An Aspendale Gardens man was stabbed with an arrow during a heated confrontation at Moorabbin Archery Club at the weekend.

A Cheltenham man, 22, was allegedly shooting arrows in a dangerous manner at the range, in Turner Rd, 10.30am, Sunday 21 May.

A club official, 79, approached to give some advice, but the man became aggressive and abusive towards the volunteer, a life member of the club.

The official stopped all target practice until the man left the field, which he did – but not before knocking the official's hat off his head.

Seeing this, a man in his 40s nearby tackled the offender and both went to the ground in a scuffle broken up by bystanders.

The 22-year-old man allegedly grabbed an arrow from a quiver and lunged at the man in his 40s, striking him twice and causing minor wounds.

Bystanders restrained the offender until police arrived.

He was taken to Moorabbin police station for interview and released. He is expected to be charged on summons with assault.

EVERY CLUB NEEDS A JUDGE!!!

Judges are essential for our tournaments to be recognised and fair.

Applications are invited for archers to train as national judge candidates - the first step to becoming accredited as an Archery Judge.

The training course will be run at Romaine Park Primary School, Cnr Mount Street and Roslyn Ave, Burnie, 7320. The course will commence at 10am on Saturday 29th July in the Staff Room and finish at the same site by 4pm on Sunday 30th July 2017.

To be eligible for the course, an archer must:

- have 12 months experience as an archer
- be a current financial member (Individual Affiliate) of Archery Australia
- have attained a minimum age of 18 years.
- pass the National Judges Open Book Examination (> 80% mark).

Applications can be made by e-mail to judgesdirector@archerytasmania.org.au by 21st July 2017. Any queries can be sent to the same address.

Certain forms will be returned to applicants for completion prior to the course, including the open book exam. For more information about pathways for archery judges, please see:

1. Not letting down
2. Focusing on aiming
3. Not Finishing
4. Testing releases
5. Focusing on negatives
6. Fiddling
7. Trash thoughts
8. Draw length
9. Punching

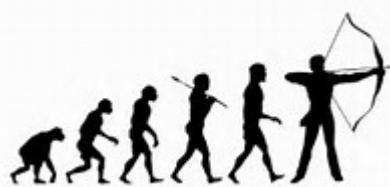
